

In 1979, our father was taken captive, after the overthrow of Idi Amin's Brutus regime. This began the long hopeless journey with our mother, who was left with 7 children and at the same time pregnant.

She always struggled to make ends meet. Provide school fees, feeding us as well as educating us.

At the beginning of 1980, she delivered her baby girl so we were now 8 children and it was not easy but she never gave up in all her endeavors. By this time she was working with Mulago Hospital as an occupational therapist. With the little she got, God enabled her to go on. It was now so difficult that she looked around for sponsorships in order to educate us.

After that, God heard her prayers and provided six of us with sponsors under the **"AFRICA FOUNDATION INC"**. At this particular time we were being sponsored while staying with our mother, they provided us with school fees, some food stuffs and clothes.

In 1988, we were all asked to join the rest of our friends in the homes by then they were 5 homes within Kampala and Mukono. We were put in the biggest home in Mukono, this comprised of babies, medium age as well as mature boys and girls.

We lived as sisters and brothers shared all the necessities like food in one dining hall and bathrooms as well as bedrooms. At the end of the holidays we would then be taken to our respective boarding schools having been provided with all the requirements needed in school.

I pursued my education from S.1 to S.6 there after I joined the "Medical Laboratory Training School" in Jinja where I completed my course as a Laboratory Technician.

I thank God for Daddy Keffa and Mummy Peninah who parented us with all the love we ought to have got from our real parents. There was no discrimination among the children we all shared from the blessings that God always provided for us.

God bless Daddy Keffa and his whole family and all the people who always picked anything from their pockets, to help educate me and the rest of my friends, sisters and brothers. Because I believe they did not have too much but because they loved to help. Today I can also cater for my needs as well as help others, as I am able.
